For Podium Paper Submissions

- Abstract should be **no more than 300 words**, excluding title and authors/advisor
- Please organize with the following sections:
 - Title:** Keep the title brief, but indicate the nature of the study or service
 - Authors:** Include all authors and denote who will present the paper, if accepted
 - Project Purpose:** Include a brief description of the problem being addressed
 - Methods:** Research methods or interventions in the case of an educational or service project
 - Results:** Specific outcomes achieved, whether a research, educational, or service project
 - Conclusions:** Relate these to results and consider the next steps to be taken in your work

For Posters Submissions

- Abstract should be **no more than 300 words**, excluding title and authors/advisor
- Please organize with the following sections:
 - Title:** Keep the title brief, but indicate the nature of the study or service
 - Authors:** Include all authors and denote who will present the paper, if accepted
 - Project Purpose:** Include a brief description of the problem being addressed
